

STAR-NEWS NEWSPAPERS 4-H HONOR PROGRAM

The Star-News Newspapers held its tenth anniversary 4-H Honor Program in Wilmington in November, 1967. The highlight of the program was a special tribute paid to the Most Representative boys and girls who had been honored during the past ten years of the program's existence. Robeson County was added to the program, bringing the total number of counties participating in the Southeastern District to ten.

Several changes and additions were made in the Saturday morning section of the event. A Junior and Senior Public Speaking Contest for boys and girls was added this year with excellent participation. The Tractor Operator Contest was changed to the Auto Skill Driving Contest in order to more nearly meet the needs of the boys and girls of this area. The 4-H Adult Leader Meeting which featured this year an exchange of ideas from the leaders of the ten counties involved continued to be one of the most beneficial segments of the program.
