The Negro County Agent of Halifax county supervised the exhibits of 4-H materials at the County Fair in Weldon and the Tri-County Fair at Littleton. Mr. T. R. Walker, Jr., Secretary-Manager of both Fairs paid \$48 for 4-H premiums. The clubs did not qualify for the garden exhibit premiums which were valued \$7.50. The exhibits were classified as follows:

The first place for general exhibits was won by Halifax County Training School 4-H club and Eastman second at Weldon Fair, but the ranking was reversed at Littleton. Prizes were awarded to - 1st Dannie Pierce (Weldon Club) for white corn and second Joseph Shaw (Everett) at Weldon Fair. Jessie Francis (Eastman) and Carol Alston (Littleton Club) won first and second places respectively at Littleton. Bertha Johnson (Eastman) received first prize for string beans at both Fairs. The second place's string beans was won by Mabel Feeble (Weldon Club) at Weldon, and Dorothy Brinson (Eastman); Lillian Meade (Everett) at Littleton. Geraldine Pittman (Eden) won first place for soup mixture at Weldon and second place at Littleton. Dorothy Brinson (Eastman) was awarded first prize for soup mixture at Littleton and Eula Reids (Roanoke Rapids) second at Weldon Fair.
