

COOPERATION OF OTHER AGENCIES AND AWARDS AVAILABLE

- A. **FEDERAL, STATE AND OTHER AGENCIES** - A working relationship was maintained with those agencies who support the State youth program. This support was in the form of rendering time and service in such capacities as judging, publicity, and cash or materials for awards. Efforts were made by the Four-H Club office through letters, reports, conferences and office consultations to keep these agencies informed of the growth and development in the 4-H Club Program.
- B. **STATE EXTENSION PERSONNEL** - Cooperation was a keynote in getting various projects and youth programs to function smoothly. The Subject Matter Specialists lent their support in those areas which they could best serve. Those fields directly concerned were Agronomy, Clothing, Foods and Nutrition, Forestry and Entomology.
- The printing of Camp and 4-H Club Week Programs, the support of the Savannah Sugar Refinery, Foley Mills Company, North Carolina Department of Agriculture, and the Federal Cartridge Cooperation were verified through the office of the State 4-H Club Leader.
- The District Supervisors and State Agent gave suggestions and guidance to the youth program through conferences with the 4-H Specialists. The execution of the total youth program was of such nature that the State and District Agents were more informed of the various activities and aided in planning them in the order of importance.
