EXCHANGE OF CLUB MEMBERS TO OTHER STATES

Another type of exchange program was that of exchange between county delegations from North Carolina to the state of Iowa. Thirty-four club members, adult leaders, and Extension workers visited Jackson County, Iowa this year. An adult leader served as chairman of the drive for funds to finance the group's trip. She used as her slogan, "On-to-Iowa." Much time was spent throughout the winter, summer and spring months in planning dances, suppers, candy sales, and auctions. Her goal of \$1,900 was accomplished. While visiting in Jackson County, Iowa, club members visited places of historical interest and lived in homes of 4-H Club members there. This experience gave them a good insight into the type of family life in that section of the mid-west. Iredell County enjoyed the opportunity of being host to Clayton County, Iowa's group of 16 girls and 16 boys and 4 adult leaders. The Extension agents in Iowa and 4-H Club members arranged for tours of dairy and livestock farms to show the group our type of agriculture. Tours to cotton mills and furniture factories to show typical industry in the state were planned and an exciting moonlight cruise on the Riverboat Robert E. Lee in the recreational Lake Norman was planned. The Iredell County club members learned much about Clayton County, Iowa farming as well as the 4-H Club program in the state from the visiting club members.
