

COLLEGIATE 4-H CLUBS

Two college 4-H Clubs are active in North Carolina. They are located at North Carolina State University at Raleigh and University of North Carolina at Greensboro. The college clubs provide continued opportunities for leadership development of young people, fellowship for those who have similar interest, service to the 4-H program and an opportunity to keep abreast of the new developments in the 4-H program. Former 4-H members or those interested in affiliation with the club can become members.

Fred H. Wagoner serves as advisor for the North Carolina State University 4-H Club and Mary Sue Moser serves as advisor for the University of North Carolina at Greensboro 4-H Club. Each of the advisors assisted the officers and members in planning their monthly programs, advised them in planning and conducting service projects and assisted with most of their monthly meetings.

Monthly educational programs are conducted by each club. The North Carolina State University 4-H Club meets every two weeks as a supper meeting in the college dining hall. One of the meetings is devoted to business and the other to an educational program. The University of North Carolina 4-H Club at Greensboro meets each second Tuesday in the School of Home Economics Building. At each of these meetings a business session is conducted and also an educational program. Some of the special activities conducted by the North Carolina University Club included the following: Operation of a checking booth for coats and articles for visitors at the North Carolina State Fair, made wooden North Carolina identification badges for the delegates attending National 4-H Club Congress, trained Wake County 4-H Club officers at county council meeting, and helped as 4-H project leaders. The University of North Carolina Club at Greensboro assisted with the Guilford County 4-H Achievement Program and made special Santa Clauses for the children at a local hospital in Greensboro. The two clubs conducted an exchange social program of entertainment on their individual campuses.
