General Information.

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Good in production

1. Lectures. This course will consist of ~~two~~ ^{three} lectures (and one, ~~two~~ hours laboratory period) per week. The lectures will be outlined in advance for the use and convenience of the students. Lecture notes are ~~not~~ required. It is suggested, ~~however~~, that each student prepare a short, concise statement covering the subject matter of each lecture. These statements may be called for. All references must be read in advance of the lectures. There will be frequent oral and written discussions.

A list of questions, covering the subject matter of each major of the field, will be prepared and given to each student. These questions are designed to aid the student in securing a thorough grasp of the subject. ~~These~~ questions will form the basis of the various written and oral examinations.

2. Laboratory Work. The laboratory exercises are designed primarily for the purpose of illustrating how the principles of agricultural economics may be applied in the solution of modern agricultural economic problems. The exercises will afford, however, considerable training in statistical method--a factor of prime importance to the student of agricultural problems.
