Changes in Personnel

Various changes took place in the counties. There were resignations because of marriage and a desire to change position; there were transfers; and there were appropriations by certain counties for assistant home agents.

- Alamance County - On October 1, 1940, Grace Lee Allen was appointed assistant home demonstration agent.
- Bertie County - On January 19, 1940, Mrs. Lucille C. Clark resigned as home agent and was succeeded on February 1 by (Mrs.) Eloise Burch (Ferry).  
On December 1, 1940 Pennie Elizabeth Pitt succeeded (Mrs.) Lillian A. Woodhouse as Negro Home agent. Lillian resigned November 15, 1940.
- Clay County - Estelle Powers resigned as of July 30, 1940. Edith Barrier was appointed home agent on October 28, 1940, to succeed Miss Powers.
- Cleveland County - La Una Brashears was transferred to Cleveland County on May 1, 1940, to succeed Hilda Sutton who resigned as of April 30.
- Davidson County - On August 31, 1940, Ellen Jenkins resigned as home agent and was succeeded on September 12 by Mrs. Evangeline T. Thompson.
- Durham County - On November 15, 1940, Kathleen Capps resigned as assistant home agent and was replaced by Helen Lanning on November 16.
