MORNING

“Power Farming Takes Over In N. C.”

This phase of the program (to be held outdoors) is planned to show farmers the orderly procurement and efficient utilization of power equipment. Machinery requirements for various sizes and types of farms will be discussed, emphasizing the impact of mechanization on farm economy and the many benefits as well as problems associated with the transition in North Carolina.

Complete displays of all items of equipment required for three sizes of farms ranging from 30 to 300 acres will be set up in the area for inspection.

Commentary directed by a popular radio commentator, with the assistance of farm machinery representatives, Agricultural Research and Extension personnel, will answer many of the current questions associated with farm mechanization in North Carolina.
