ENCAMPMENTS.

Twenty-one county encampments were held during the summer months in the following counties.

Avery, Bladen, Buncombe, Cabarrus, Chowan, Columbus, Durham, Jackson, Johnston, Madison, New Hanover, Onslow, Perquimans, Robeson, Rutherford, Sampson, Stanley, Swain, Transylvania and Union.

The objects of the camps are to provide an enjoyable and instructive vacation in reach of every club member. The camp was held within the county at some convenient place where, if possible, buildings, plenty of good water, play grounds and a swimming hole was convenient. Where houses could not be secured, tents were used. The Director provided ten tents which were loaned to the county for helping out in such cases.

The length of these camps was from two to three days. Each member brought a definite amount of food, a blanket and a pair of overalls or a work dress, ^{and other personal necessities to last thru camp} A definite program was arranged and carried out by the county agents, which consisted of work in the morning, recreation in the afternoon and social and inspirational at night. These camps were very worth while and should be continued.
