J. D. Gray, Farm Maker's Club Agent, is in charge of this work. The local agents, or negro county agents, promote the work in their counties. In addition to what the local agents are doing, many clubs have been organized in other territory in co-operation with the negro school supervisors and school teachers.

Negro club work, no doubt is fitting the boys to do better farm work. Intelligent farm work must be done by all who till the soil before we may expect the greater results from our crops and livestock. The following report by J. D. Gray, Farm Makers' Club Agent, shows the results of last year's work:

"The fourth year of the Negro Boys' and Girls' club work is marked with continued progress and intense interest. So much so that it is a physical impossibility for the club agent to meet the numerous demands for his services. The office work has been neglected in an effort to meet the requirements in the field."

"The County Club Round-up held during the summer was a great success. They were really farm picnics, because each family brought baskets, melons, fruit, ice, lemons and ice cream. The children brought base balls and bats. This appealed to both parents and children, and they came in great numbers. The meetings were held in large groves near a school house or church, convenient to water, shade and shelter in case of rain. We had variously from 300 to 800 people at these meetings. It is interesting to note that on each occasion they decided to make this annual affair on a much more elaborate scale."
