

CLOTHING

PLAN OF WORK 1929

Location: Work in the counties having elected Clothing as their major projects: Buncombe, Bladen, Carteret, Cabarrus, Chowan, Craven, Madison, Moore, Pitt, and Rowan. In the above counties both women and girls' clubs carry Clothing as a major project. In the counties following girls are carrying Clothing as major: Alamance, Caldwell, Catawba, Cleveland, Franklin, Martin, Richmond, Stanly, Vance, and Wayne.

Three of the colored agents are planning to give Clothing as a major project and I plan to help them.

Object: To help women and girls in planning, selecting, and making clothing for themselves and their families, in order that they may be better judges of materials and their uses and thus better spenders. To create an interest in Clothing from the standpoint of health, also as a means of improving one's looks.

Program Determination:

- a. Assist in carrying out the Clothing program for women and girls as outlined in the long time plan of work.
- b. Hold leaders' schools in all counties selecting clothing as a major project.
- c. Prepare subject matter guides to be used in club meetings by agents and leaders.

Organization: The Clothing program is divided into units, two to four lessons to the unit. Each club member is expected to attend at least six meetings in her major subject a year for two con-

secutive years and to fulfill certain requirements in order to receive an award of merit in Clothing. The summer months are usually given over to minor projects.

The work will be conducted through leaders' schools. The specialist will meet the local leaders once every two months and the agent will meet them every other month, thus the leaders have a school every month where they get instruction for the coming club meeting. The specialist furnishes plans of work and aid in presenting it, also assists in making out the program for the county.

An Achievement Day will be held once a year at which time the progress made in this project will be presented to all club members and the public in general.

Record sheets are furnished the local leaders. These are to be kept and filed with the agent at the end of the year.
