4-H GOALS FOR 1946

1. ORGANIZATION:

Continue organizing and meeting with the small neighborhood groups during the months school is not in session.

2. HEALTH:

Have physical exam given to every 4-H Member in the County and an accurate health record kept by the members.

3. 4-H CHURCH SUNDAY:

Have a certain number of 4-H members taking part in Church Programs on 4-H Church Sunday and more churches to observe 4-H Club Sunday.

4. RECORDS:

Have members keep more complete records starting as soon as they become 4-H members as their long-time record is very important when they enter contests.

5. CONTEST:

Encourage more members to enter all the National 4-H Contests.

6. RECREATION:

Have a Club Rally.

Continue having some form of recreation at each club meeting and White Lake Camp for one week.

GOALS FOR 1946

1. ORGANIZATION:

Continue membership drive to enroll members in each of the twenty-four Home Demonstration Clubs. Increased number of neighborhood leaders in some neighborhoods in order that the leaders will not have such large groups of families.

2. FOOD PRODUCTION:

Adequate production and conservation of a planned food supply to meet the nutritional needs of the farm families.

- (a) Year round gardens
- (b) Succession of fruit
More small fruit
- (c) Family cow
- (d) Standard flock of poultry

3. Food Preparation:

Planning and preparation of daily meals with respect to health requirements following the principles of the basic seven chart.

- (a) Greater knowledge of food values
- (b) Better methods of preparation to retain the nutritive value of food
- (c) Correct faulty food habits

4. HOME MANAGEMENT:

Information on the housing program available for every family needing assistance.

Work for convenient, comfortable and attractive homes at a minimum cost.

Cultivate a desire for attractive homes and surroundings.

Increased family income by better planning.

Better farm and home records.

5. Health:

Information on hospitalization made available for every farm family.

Definite plans for adequate rest.

Close cooperation with health department.

6. EDUCATION:

Home Demonstration Clubs sponsor book stations in cooperation with the County Library.

Thirty women work for reading certificates.

Visual aid featuring the program of work.

7. RECREATION:

(a) Community and neighborhood picnics

(b) Camp for women

(c) Some form of recreation at all home demonstration club meetings.
